SERMON NOTES

“Finding or Losing?”

Can you be a true Christian and be selfish? Matthew 10:38-39.

Matthew 10 deals with taking up our cross and Matthew 11 deals with putting on our yoke. Both symbols represent the giving up of the will to Christ.

Life could be divided into three areas. Three areas where we choose to be selfish or unselfish.

I. Health

Was Jesus selfish about His health? Luke 6:12, Psalm 127:2, Psalm 63:5,6.
 Physical rest = sleep
 Emotional rest=opening your heart to God as a friend.

II. Time

Luke 10:30-37. Why was the good Samaritan considered good—better than the priest and Levite?
 Was Jesus selfish with His time? Mark 15:21-29.

III. Money

The eastern guru and his disciples. Was Jesus selfish with His money? John 13:29, Malachi 3:10, Mark 12:38-44.

The death of Jesus on the cross was the most unselfish act every performed in the universe.

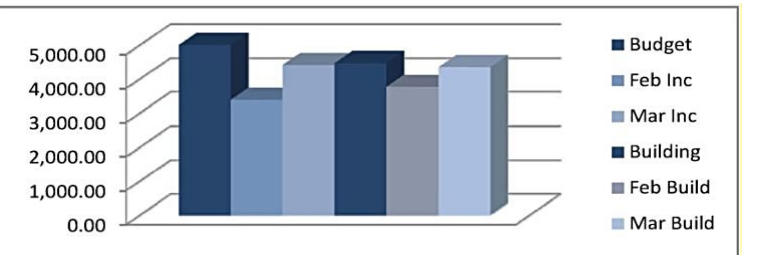

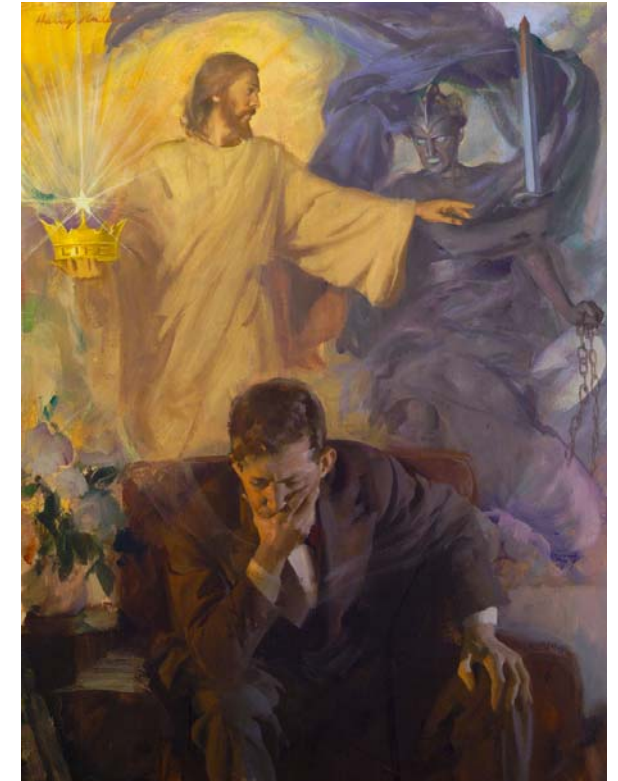
